2. Describe the groups of people that Paul and Timothy write to (verse 1).
3. Explain "grace" and "peace" in your own words.
4. In verse 6, what does Paul say that God will continue to do?
5. What is one of Paul's primary goals in life? (verse 11)
6. What goals do you have in your life?
7. Some good things have happened because Paul is in prison. What are they? (verse 14)
8. In verse 20, Paul says that he hoped for 3 things. What are they?
9. How do you conduct yourself in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ? (verse 27)
10. Where is Philippi?
11. Where is Paul when he writes this letter?
12. The theme of Philippians is joy in suffering. How is that possible?
